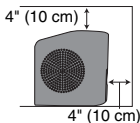

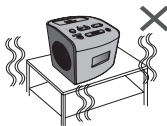
## Precautions

### ■ General

- Please ensure that the equipment is positioned in a well-ventilated area and ensure that there is at least 4" (10 cm) of free space along the sides, top and back of the equipment.



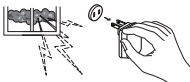
- Use the unit on a firm, level surface free from vibration.



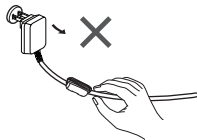

## ■ Connecting iPod or iPhone to TV

Video files from iPod or iPhone can be viewed by connecting the system to TV/monitor.

If the TV/monitor has a video input, connect it to the VIDEO OUT jack at the back of the unit and set the TV Out on the iPod or iPhone unit to "ON" position.



## ■ Watching videos on a TV connected to iPod

**1 Press the FUNCTION button on the main unit to select the iPod function.**

**2 Enter the iPod or iPhone menu.**

Press and hold DISPLAY(TV OUT) button on main unit until ON appear on display.

**3 Select the desired video to be played.**

**4 Press the ENTER button on the iPod unit to start playback.**

For iPod touch and iPhone, playback will automatically start once the desired file is selected.

### Notes:

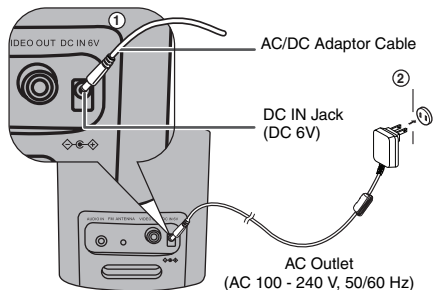
- To return to watch video on iPod or iPhone screen, return to the iPod menu. Press and hold the DISPLAY(TV OUT) on main unit until "OFF" appear on display.
- During iPod video playback, pressing the DISPLAY(TV OUT) button until "OFF" appear on display will not toggle video out display between iPod and TV.

- Please make sure to set iPod unit to either NTSC or PAL to match your TV signal. Please visit Apple's home page for further information.
- Customer should also refer iPod operation manual before making video out setting.

## ■ AC/DC adaptor connection

**1 Plug the AC/DC adaptor cable into the DC IN jack on the unit.**

**2 Plug the AC/DC adaptor into an AC outlet.**



### Notes:

- Unplug the AC/DC adaptor from the AC outlet if the unit will not be used for a prolonged period of time.
- Use only the supplied AC/DC adaptor. Using other AC/DC adaptor may cause an electric shock or fire.
- During unit operational with batteries, iPod/iPhone attached can be used for playback only.

### CAUTION:

## System connections (continued)

### ■ Install/Replace backup batteries

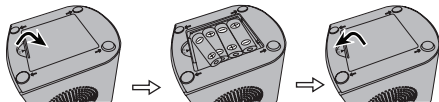
Use 4 "AA" size batteries (UM/SUM-3, R6, HP-7 or similar). Batteries are not included.

#### 1 Open the battery cover.

#### 2 Insert the batteries according to the direction indicated in the battery compartment.

When inserting or removing the batteries, push them towards the ⊖ battery terminal.

#### 3 Close the cover.



#### Notes:

- Backup battery system is used to provide continuous alarm operation and clock setting in event of a power failure. During battery replacement, please make sure the AC/DC adaptor is connected, otherwise all settings may be lost.
- Remove the batteries if the unit will not be used for a long period of time to prevent battery leakage which may cause potential damage.
- The first time the batteries are installed, the clock will blink on the display. Please set the time and date (refer page 11).

#### Note:

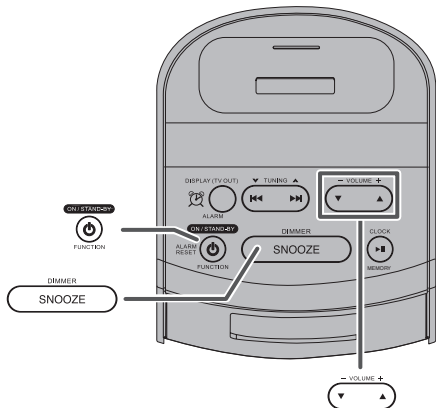
Battery life may vary depending on the temperature, battery types and usage conditions.

#### Precautions for battery use:

- Installing the batteries incorrectly may cause the unit to malfunction.
- Insert the batteries according to the direction indicated in the battery compartment.
- Replace all old batteries with new ones at the same time.
- Do not mix old and new batteries.
- Batteries (battery pack or batteries installed) shall not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunshine, fire or the like.

#### Caution:

Do not use rechargeable batteries (nickel-cadmium battery, etc.).



## ■ To turn the power on

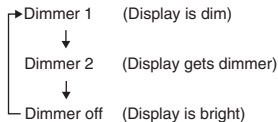
Press the ON/STANDBY button to turn the power on. The first time power is supplied to the unit, the clock will be blinking on the display. Please set the time and date (refer page 11).

### After use:

Press and hold the ON/STANDBY button to enter the power stand-by mode.

## ■ Display brightness control (DIMMER)

Press the SNOOZE/DIMMER button to adjust the brightness of LCD display.



### Notes:

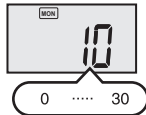
- Setting dimmer to display in the brightest mode during battery operation will affect battery life.
- During battery operation in standby mode, the brightness of the display will automatically go to the lowest mode (dim OFF) after 5 seconds.

## ■ Volume auto set in

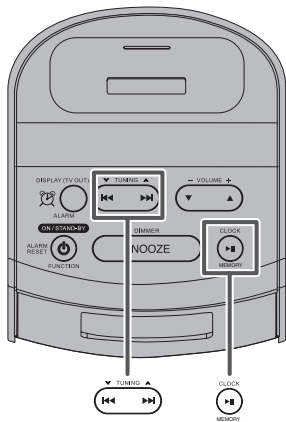
If you turn off and on the main unit with the volume set to 17 or higher, the volume starts at 16.

## ■ Volume control

Press the VOLUME (+ or -) button to increase or decrease the volume. Volume indicator will be blinking when volume reaches maximum and minimum level.

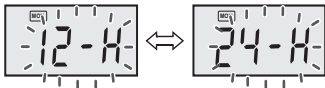


## Setting the time and date



In this example, the clock is set for the 12-H (12 hour) display.

- 1** In standby mode, press the **CLOCK** button for more than 2 seconds. The clock time display will be blinking.



Press the **◀▶** or **▶▶** button to select clock time display format and then press **CLOCK** button.

- 2** Press the **◀▶** or **▶▶** button to adjust the hour and then press the **CLOCK** button.



Press the **◀▶** or **▶▶** button once to advance the time by 1 hour. Hold it down to advance continuously. "AM" or "PM" indicator will interchange after each 12 hour cyclic in 12-H clock format.

- 3** Press the **◀▶** or **▶▶** button to adjust the minutes and then press the **CLOCK** button.



Press the **◀▶** or **▶▶** button once to advance the time by 1 minute. Hold it down for about 2 seconds to change the time in 5-minutes interval.

- 4** Press the **◀▶** or **▶▶** button to adjust the day and then press the **CLOCK** button.



“.” will be blinking to indicate time and date setting is completed.

### Note:

During battery operations in standby mode, press the **SNOOZE/DIMMER** button to display the clock for about 5 seconds.

### Notes:

- Once the iPod or iPhone is connected to the unit it will begin charging.
- If you have an iPod or iPhone that does not have an iPod 30 Pin connector, you can use an auxiliary cable to connect it to the AUDIO IN jack.
- The message "This accessory is not made to work with iPhone" or similar, may appear on the iPhone screen when:
  - battery is low.
  - the iPhone is not properly docked (eg. slanting).If this occurs, remove and re-dock the iPhone.
- The iPod or iPhone will not be charged while the main unit uses batteries as power supply.

## ■ iPod and iPhone adaptor connection

### Note:

You can use an audio cable to connect your iPod or iPhone to the AUDIO IN socket if:

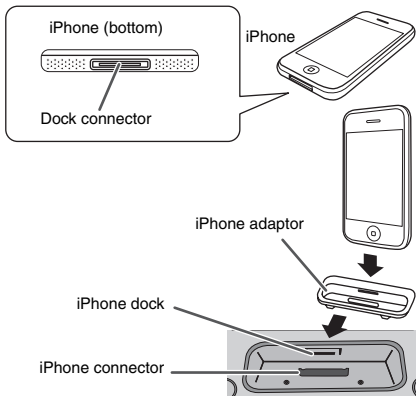
1. your iPod or iPhone adaptor does not fit into the dock on the main unit.
2. you have an iPod or iPhone that does not have an iPod or iPhone adaptor.
3. you have an iPod that does not have an iPod 30 pin connector.

### ■ To insert iPod or iPhone adaptor

1. Insert the iPod or iPhone adaptor into unit and connect your iPod or iPhone.

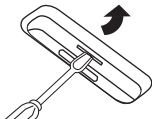


#### Caution:

Unplug all accessories for the iPod or iPhone before inserting it into the dock.

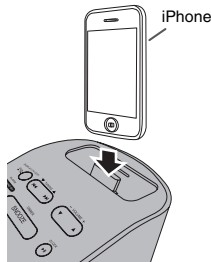
### ■ To remove iPod or iPhone adaptor

Insert the tip of a screwdriver ("-" type, small) into the adaptor hole as shown and lift upward to remove.



### ■ iPod or iPhone playback

- 1 Press the ON/STAND-BY button to turn the power on.
- 2 Press the FUNCTION button on main unit to select the iPod function.
- 3 Insert iPod or iPhone unit in the dock of main unit.








- 4 Press the ►/|| button on the iPod unit to start playback.

For iPod touch and iPhone, playback will automatically start once the desired file is selected.

### ■ To disconnect iPod or iPhone

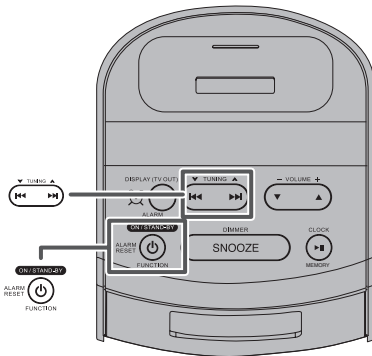
Simply remove the iPod or iPhone from the dock. It is safe to do so even during playback.

## ■ Various iPod or iPhone functions

Function	Main unit	Operation
<b>Play</b>	CLOCK  MEMORY	Press in the pause mode.
<b>Pause</b>	CLOCK  MEMORY	Press in the playback mode.
<b>Track up/down</b>	▼ TUNING ▲ 	Press in the playback or pause mode. If you press the button in the pause mode, press the ►/   button to start the desired track.
<b>Fast forward/ reverse</b>	▼ TUNING ▲ 	Press and hold down in the playback mode. Release the button to resume playback.
<b>TV OUT</b>	DISPLAY (TV OUT)  ALARM	Press for more than 2 seconds to toggle the video out display between iPod or iPhone and TV.

## iPod and iPhone operation

The operations described above depend on the generation iPod or iPhone you are using.



## ■ Tuning

- 1 Press the ON/STAND-BY button to turn the power on.**
- 2 Press the FUNCTION button to select the Tuner function.**

## Listening to the radio (continued)

### 3 Tune to the desired station.

#### Manual tuning:

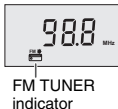
Press the TUNING (∨ or ∧) button as many times as required to tune in to the desired station.

#### Auto tuning:

When the TUNING (∨ or ∧) button is pressed for more than 0.5 seconds, scanning will start automatically and the tuner will stop at the first receivable broadcast station.

#### Notes:

- After 5 seconds the tuner frequency will change to time display. To preview the tuner frequency, press DISPLAY(TV OUT) button.
- When radio interference occurs, auto scan tuning may stop automatically at that point.
- Auto scan tuning will skip weak signal stations.
- To stop the auto tuning, press the TUNING (∨ or ∧) button again.



#### Receiving an FM stereo transmission:

- If the FM reception is weak, the reception will auto changes to monaural, and the sound becomes clearer.

### ■ Programming a station

You can store 20 FM stations in memory and recall them at the push of a button. (Preset tuning)

**1** Perform steps 1 - 3 in "Tuning" on pages 14 - 15.

**2** While the Tuner frequency is display, press the MEMORY button for more than 2 seconds on the main unit to enter the preset tuning saving mode.



**3** Within 5 seconds, press the MEMORY button repeatedly to select the preset channel number.

Store the stations in memory, in order, starting with preset channel 1.

**4** Within 5 seconds, press and hold the MEMORY button on main unit to store that station in memory.

If the preset number indicators disappear before the station is programmed, repeat the operation from step 2.

**5** Repeat steps 1 - 4 to set other stations, or to change a preset station.

When a new station is stored in memory, the station previously programmed for that preset channel number will be erased.

#### Note:

The backup batteries function protects the programmed stations should there be a power failure or the AC/DC adaptor becomes disconnected. If the backup batteries are drain off, the programmed stations will be erased.

### ■ To recall a programmed station

Press MEMORY button repeatedly to select the desired programmed station.



# Alarm operation

## ■ Alarm

The unit turns on and play desired source (iPod, iPhone or TUNER) or Buzzer sound for 1 hour alarm cycle.

### Before setting the alarm:

- 1 Check that the clock is set to the correct time. (refer page 11)  
If it is not set, you cannot use the alarm function.
- 2 For iPod playback: Insert iPod or iPhone to the unit. (refer page 13)
- 3 For TUNER: Set preset memory. (refer page 15)



### Setting the alarms

- 1 In standby mode, press and hold the ALARM button until the alarm time and alarm icon blinking.



- 2 Press the ◀ or ▶ button to adjust the hour and press the ALARM button.



Press the ◀ or ▶ button once to advance the time by 1 hour. Hold it down to advance continuously. "AM" or "PM" indicator will interchange after each 12 hour cyclic.

- 3 Press the ◀ or ▶ button to adjust the minutes and then press the ALARM button.



Press the ◀ or ▶ button once to advance the time by 1 minute. Hold it down to change the time in 5 minutes interval.

- 4 Press the ◀ or ▶ button to select the day for the alarm and then press alarm button.



Everyday: MON - SUN (Alarm activate daily)  
Weekday: MON - FRI (Alarm activate from Monday to Friday only)  
Weekend: SAT - SUN (Alarm activate from Saturday to Sunday only)

- 5 Press the ◀ or ▶ button to select the wake up source and then press the ALARM button.



Wake up source selection:

BUZZER → RADIO → iPod  
↑

Alarm icon "🔔" will light up to indicate alarm setting is complete.

## Alarm operation (continued)

### Note:

If wake up source is set to iPod, and iPod is not present, the alarm source will change to default Buzzer.

### ■ Activate and deactivate the alarm

- 1 During standby mode, press **ALARM** button to deactivate current alarm times and wake up source.
- 2 Press **ALARM** button again to reactivate the last alarm function. When the alarm setting time is activated, alarm information will shown for 5 seconds and alarm icon (🔔) will appear on display.



- 3 When alarm has started, alarm icon (🔔) will blinking on the display.

### Daily Alarm:

- During alarm is function, press **ALARM RESET** button to stop alarm and it will come again on the next day.



### Sure Alarm:

- When power failure, the alarm will function if the backup batteries are installed.

### ■ Snooze function

Once alarm has started, pressing the **SNOOZE/DIMMER** button will stop alarm for 9 minutes.

During snooze, "🔕" icon will light up and "🔔" icon will blinking.

Once the snooze function is over, the alarm will start again. The snooze function can be operated during 1 hour alarm cycle.

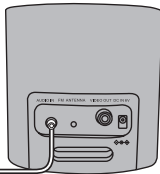

## Troubleshooting chart

Many potential problems can be resolved by the owner without calling a service technician. If something is wrong with this product, check the following before calling your authorized SHARP dealer or service center.

### ■ General

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● No sound is heard.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Is the volume level set to "0"?</li> </ul>

### ■ Tuner

Symptom	Possible cause
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● The radio makes unusual noises continuously.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Is the unit placed near the TV or computer?</li> <li>● Is the FM antenna placed properly? Move the antenna away from the AC/DC adaptor if it is located nearby.</li> </ul>

### ■ Listening to the audio/video sounds from portable audio player, computer etc.

#### 1 Use the auxiliary cable to connect the portable audio player, computer etc. to the AUDIO IN jack.

When using video equipment, connect the audio output to this unit and the video output to a television.

#### 2 Press the ON/STAND-BY button to turn the power on.

#### 3 Press the FUNCTION button to select AUX function.

### ■ Condensation
